**ORIGIN :-**

Dnyanvardhini Trust was founded in the year 1982 to fill in the vacuum in the field of education in Shahapur Tahsil. There was no Degree College in the belt extending from Igatpuri to Bhiwandi and Kalyan. Some socially awakened people from this Tahsil came together and ultimately Dnyanvardhini Trust was founded.

The actual establishment of the college was made possible due to the generous gift of 6.5 acres of land by Late V. C. Godbole, B.Sc. (Hons). In the beginning, the college was housed in the premises of G. V. Khade Vidyalaya, Shahapur managed by The Shahapur Taluka Education Society. The college at present is situated in a calm and quiet campus situated for the purpose of education at a distance of about 18 minutes 'walk' from Asangaon Station and Shahapur Town.

A spacious building has been constructed in the course of time, step by step, out of donations from generous donors and organizations and NGOs and through the financial assistance of University Grants Commission, New Delhi. Apart from the spacious class-rooms, the college has well-equipped library with a separate Reading Room facility for Boys and Girls and Teaching Staff well-developed I.T. and Electronic laboratory, the Gymnasium with advanced equipments, well-furnished Seminar Hall etc. Due care is taken to appoint highly qualified Associate Professors and Assistant for various subjects.

In addition to the curricular and educational activities college organises a number of co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for all round development of its students. The college has also Commerce Association, Itihas Abhyas Mandal, Arthshastra Mandal, Marathi Vangmaya Mandal, Hindi Sahitya Mandal and English Literary Association, Student Forum, N.S.S., N.C.C., Women's Development Cell etc.

The University of Mumbai has granted permission to start B.Com in Accounting & Finance (Additional division), M.Com and M.Sc.(IT) from the year 2021-2022.

### 4) LIBRARY

The college management has provided separate floor of 3600 sq.ft. for the library. The library is very specious and well equipped with Text Books, Reference Books, Books of Competitive Exams, Audio and Video CD's, Journals and News Papers. The total collections of library is as follows Books 40563, Periodicals 50, Periodical bound volumes 540, News Papers 06, CD's / DVD's – 318, Maps 51, Online E-Journals-6000+, Online E-Books 97,000+.

### 5) BOOK BANK SCHEME :

The central Library of the college runs Book Bank Schemes for SC/ST/NT students where the text books are provided for the tenure of an academic year.

### 6) INTERNET FACILITY:

The central Library of the college provides broad band internet facility to students free of cost.

### 7) DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARIES

Besides College Library, Department of Hindi, Marathi, English, Commerce, History, B.Sc.I.T., B.B.I. & B.A.F. run their own departmental libraries. Every department issue their own books to their students. The students take benefits of both the libraries.

### 8) DIGITAL CLASS ROOM :

The classrooms of our college are well equipped with LCD Projector and Faculties are provided with Laptops. Teaching-learning is based on ICT and is highly interactive.

### 9) SURVILLANCE SECURITY SYSTEM :

The college has Surveillance Cameras in each classroom and the college premises is under Surveillance Security System to avoid undesirable occurrences or to provide security to the female staff and students. The Fire Extinguisher is available in our college.

### 10) GROUP INSURANCE :

The college charges Rs. 20/- as Group Insurance as per existing rules of Mumbai University under which a students get life coverage for an academic year. Under this scheme the college has also provided a security of Rs. 1,00,000/- to every student by their Group Insurance for which students will have to pay a very nominal premium of Rs. 20/- each year.

**11) STUDENTS' WELFARE FUND :**

The college has introduced 'Students' Welfare Fund' with the intention to help the needy and economically backward students, from November, 2002 who may be deprived from higher education due to their bad economic conditions. They are provided with economic assistance for examination fee, admission fee, other fees etc. They are also provided other types of help wherever necessary. The needy students are instructed to take advantage of this facility and complete their higher education from this college.

**12) CANTEEN FACILITY :**

The college has canteen facility where the eatables are provided at subsidised rates. Food products are prepared by taking care of health and hygiene of students and staff and there is separate seating arrangement for students and staff in the college canteen.

**13) ANTI-RAGGING AND GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL:**

### 32) **ADMISSION :**

All admissions are provisional and subject to the confirmation of the University of Mumbai.

#### **D) Online Admission and Registration to F.Y.B.A. / B.Com. / B.Sc.I.T./ B.B.I. / B.A.F.:-**

As per the Circular of University of Mumbai Vide Enrol/1812/2013 dated April 18, 2013, it is mandatory for every student seeking admission to First Year of B.A. / B.Com / B.Sc.I.T. / B.Com with Banking and Insurance / B.Com (Account and Finance) to fill up an enrollment from online indicating his / her preferred colleges. The student has to bring a printout of this on-line filled up enrollment format at the time of admission. He/She has to submit the same along with the admission form of the college and document necessary for admission. On the successful completion of this process along with payment of fees the admission of the student gets confirmed.

**Note :** Admissions to first year of all streams in the academic year 2024-25 are subject to the prospective National Education Policy - 2020 and the guidelines by the University of Mumbai from time to time.

#### **II) Conditions of Admission**

- i) An admission given to the student in this college to any class shall be only for the particular term.
- ii) A student admitted to one class shall not get automatic admission to the higher class in the subsequent year. It shall be at the discretion of the Principal.
- iii) Every student is expected to take fresh admission every year / term and there would be nothing like claim or reservation of seat for the College Students to any class.
- iv) Students should be punctual and regular in attendance and should observe the discipline in the College premises. Students who are found irregular in attendance and / or have bad performance at the College / University Examination will not be admitted to the second term / subsequent year as the case may be. Cases of such students shall be decided by the Principal.
- v) Admission of Students to any class in this College is subject to the Rules and Regulations of this College, contained in this Prospectus and that of the University of Mumbai framed from time to time. - vi) The Admission of Students failing to pay their Second Term Fees within the prescribed time will be automatically cancelled and their names will be struck off the roll. He/She will however have to pay all the fees for the second term.
- vii) As per the rules of the affiliation, 50% seats have been reserved for the Students of the Backward Classes, However, if the sufficient number of Backward Class Students is not available the remaining seats will be filled up by admitting the students from the Non-Backward Class.
- viii) When a student cancels his / her admission, the fees shall be refunded according to the rules prescribed by the University of Mumbai from time to time. A specimen of such rules is given below separately.

**III) At the time of admission, students seeking admission to F.Y.B.A. / F.Y.B.Com. Class shall have to submit the following :**

- a) Original copy of School / College Leaving Certificate in support of the date of birth and two copies thereof.
- b) H.S.C. Examination Mark-Sheet Original and three copies thereof.
- c) Caste Certificate
- d) Income Certificate of Parents for the previous year.

**IV) Students should note the following University Rules :**

**0.114-A:**

1) Students passing examination equivalent to Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) Examination conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and higher Secondary Education and intermediate Arts / Commerce of University of Mumbai Universities / Boards and seeking admission to the F.Y.B.A., F.Y.B.Com., Class will be admitted only on production of provisional Eligibility Certificate issued by the University of Mumbai. They should submit the migration Certificate, statement of Marks and passing certificate in original alongwith a copy within two months from the date of admission failing which their admission is liable for cancellation.

2) Students coming from other constituent / affiliated college of the University of Mumbai will be admitted provisionally on production of the No Objection Certificate from the college last attended. Their admission will be confirmed only on receipt of the Transference Certificate from their previous college. For this purpose, they should submit the Transference Certificate application form and T. C. Fees to the previous college.

3) **RULES OF REFUND OF FEES :**

Rules of refund of fees are as per University Circular No. UG/114 of 2008, dated 27/03/2008.

**33) I) Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) :-**

The University of Mumbai has introduced Choice Based Credit System in result with the intention of bringing our students to the international level. Instead of marksheets Grade Card will be given to the students. It would allow our students to get admission to any college in the world under this system the University has introduced a Semester Pattern. The semester pattern will be followed for the examinations of the students.

**II) Rules of A.T.K.T. under New Examination System :-**

A.T.K.T. for Faculties of Arts & Commerce :-

- A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester II irrespective of number heads of failure in the Semester I.
- A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester III-if he/she passes each of Semester I & Semester II.

OR

A learner who fails in not more than two courses of Semester I and Semester II taken together with not more than two courses each in semester I and II.

- A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester IV irrespective of number of heads of failure in Semester III. However, the learner shall pass each course of Semester I and Semester II in order to appear for Semester IV.
- A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester V – if he/she passes Semester I, Semester II, Semester III and Semester IV.

OR

A learner shall pass Semester I and Semester II and fails in not more than four courses of Semester III and Semester IV taken together with not more than two courses each in Semester III and Semester IV.

- A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester VI irrespective of number of heads of failure in the Semester V. However, the learner shall pass each course of Semester III and Semester IV in order to appear for Semester VI.
- The result of Semester VI shall be kept in abeyance until the learner passes each of Semester I, Semester II, Semester III, Semester III, Semester IV and Semester V.

### 34) ELIGIBILITY FOR THE THREE YEAR INTEGRATED COURSE

#### 1) F.Y.B.A. : 0.2138 :

A Candidate for being eligible for admission to the Three Year integrated Course leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII). Examination conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Pune, Mumbai, Aurangabad, Nagpur, Kolhapur and Amaravat Divisional Boards in the prescribed subjects :

#### 2) F.Y.B.Com.: 0.2152 :

A Candidate for being eligible for admission to the Three years integrated Course Leading in the degree of Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII). Examination conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary Education, Pune, Mumbai, Aurangabad, Nagpur, Kolhapur & Amaravati Divisional Boards in the prescribed subjects :

#### 3) S.Y.B.A. :

The candidate must have passed the F.Y.B.A. Examination of the University of Mumbai or of any other University recognized as equivalent thereto by the University of Mumbai.

#### 4) S.Y.B.Com.

The candidate must have passed the F.Y.B.Com Examination of the University of Mumbai or of any other University recognized as equivalent thereto by the University of Mumbai.

#### 5) T.Y.B.A.

The candidate must have passed the S.Y.B.A. Examination of the University of Mumbai or of any University recognized as equivalent thereto by the University of Mumbai.

#### 6) T.Y.B.Com. :

The candidate must have passed the S.Y.B.Com Examination of the University of Mumbai or of any other University recognized as equivalent thereof by the University of Mumbai.

### 35) RULES OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE FOR THE STUDENTS:

#### 1. General :

- a) The College attaches great importance to discipline and expects all concerned to observe scrupulously the Rules and Regulations made for this purpose, because a healthy discipline is essential for sound education.
- b) The Rules and Regulations would be modified by the University from time to time.
- c) Principal reserves the right to decide whether a particular Act constitutes an act of indiscipline.
- d) The powers relating to the disciplinary action in respect of the students of the college are vested in the authority of the Principal.

#### 2) Identity Card :

Every student must possess a valid Identity Card. The Identity Card must be provided whenever demanded by any member of the Teaching and / or Non-Teaching Staff. No student without Identity Card would be allowed to participate in curricular, co-curricular or extra-curricular activities of the College. No student will be issued the Transference Certificate unless he / she surrenders his / her Identity Card.

#### 3) Attendance :

Vide G. R. No. N.G.C./3593 (7211) Vishi-2, Dtd. 08/08/1993, Govt. of Maharashtra has given strict instructions about the Attendance. Accordingly all colleges in Maharashtra are observing the rules of Attendance very strictly.

Therefore, students are expected to attend all the Lectures, Tutorials, Seminars according to the Time – Table. They should not remain absent from Lectures, Tutorials, Seminars and Examination.

Attendance is compulsory even in the case of students belonging to EBC / SC / ST / DTNT / VJNT / OBC categories. If they fail to fulfill the conditions of attendance, they will not be given admit cards and will not be allowed to appear for the Final Examination under University ordinance No. 119 and they will have to pay all the fees as usual.

Principal's discretion will be final in this matter.

Those students who do not satisfy the minimum requirement of **attendance of 75%** of the lecturing days for a term will not be admitted in the college for the next term and they will be liable for disciplinary action including fine, refusal of grant of term, etc. If their attendance is less than **75%** they will not be allowed to appear for the Final Examination and Principal's decision will be final in such case.

#### 4) S. T. (Bus) & Railway Concession :

Only unemployed students below the age of 25 years are eligible for Local Train / S. T. Bus Concessions. The respective application form should be submitted to the college office 2 days in advance. Long Journey concessions will be allowed to authorised study tour or for another bonafide purpose only.

**N.B. :** S.T. Bus and Railway concession will be given only on production of the due Ration Card.

#### 5) Notices displayed on the Notice Board :

It is the responsibility of the students to read the notice displayed by the college office from time to time. They will not be excused and no concession will be given on the ground of ignorance due to their failure to read the notices.

#### 6) Expulsion :

**If for any reason, in the opinion of the Principal, which shall be final the continuance of a student in the college is deemed detrimental to any interest of the college, the Principal may rusticate such student from the college without assigning any reason or the decision.**
