#### ORIGIN:-

Dnyanvardhini Trust was founded in the year 1982 to fill in the vacuum in the field of education in Shahapur Tahsil. There was no Degree College in the belt extending from Igatpuri to Bhiwandi and Kalyan. Some socially awakened people from this Tahsil came together and ultimately Dnyanvardhini Trust was founded.

The actual establishment of the college was made possible due to the generous gift of 6.5 acres of land by Late V. C. Godbole, B.Sc. (Hons). In the beginning, the college was housed in the premises of G. V. Khade Vidyalaya, Shahapur managed by The Shahapur Taluka Education Society. The college at present is situated in a calm and quiet campus situated for the purpose of education at a distance of about 18 minutes 'walk' from Asangaon Station and Shahapur Town.

A spacious building has been constructed in the course of time, step by step, out of donations from generous donors and organizations and NGOs and through the financial assistance of University Grants Commission, New Delhi. Apart from the spacious class-rooms, the college has well-equipped library with a separate Reading Room facility for Boys and Girls and Teaching Staff well-developed I.T. and Electronic laboratory, the Gymnasium with advanced equipments, well-furnished Seminar Hall etc. Due care is taken to appoint highly qualified Associate Professors and Assistant for various subjects.

In addition to the curricular and educational activities college organises a number of co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for all round development of its students. The college has also Commerce Association, Itihas Abhyas Mandal, Arthshastra Mandal, Marathi Vangmaya Mandal, Hindi Sahitya Mandal and English Literary Association, Student Forum, N.S.S., N.C.C., Women's Development Cell etc.

The University of Mumbai has granted permission to start B.Com in Accounting & Finance (Additional division), M.Com and M.Sc.(IT) from the year 2021-2022.

The College and its class rooms have been duly examined by the members of the Local Enquiry Committee appointed by the University of Mumbai. They have granted the status of permanent affiliation vide letter No. AFF/Recog./1878 of 1997 Dtd. 27<sup>th</sup> March 1997.

#### 6) INTERNET FACILITY:

The central Library of the college provides broad band internet facility to students free of cost.

#### 7) <u>DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARIES</u>

Besides College Library, Department of Hindi, Marathi, English, Commerce, History, B.Sc.I.T., B.B.I. & B.A.F. run their own departmental libraries. Every department issue their own books to their students. The students take benefits of both the libraries.

#### 8) DIGITAL CLASS ROOM:

The classrooms of our college are well equipped with LCD Projector and Faculties are provided with Laptops. Teaching-learning is based on ICT and is highly interactive.

### 9) <u>SURVILLENCE SECURITY SYSTEM:</u>

The college has Survillence Cameras in each classroom and the college premises is under Survillence Security System to avoid undesirable occurrences or to provide security to the female staff and students. The Fire Extinguisher is available in our college.

#### 10) **GROUP INSURANCE:**

The college charges Rs. 20/- as Group Insurance as per existing rules of Mumbai University under which a students get life coverage for an academic year. Under this scheme the college has also provided a security of Rs. 1,00,000/- to every student by their Group Insurance for which students will have to pay a very nominal premium of Rs. 20/- each year.

### 11) STUDENTS' WELFARE FUND:

The college has introduced 'Students' Welfare Fund' with the intention to help the needy and economically backward students, from November, 2002 who may be deprived from higher education due to their bad economic conditions. They are provided with economic assistance for examination fee, admission fee, other fees etc. They are also provided other types of help wherever necessary. The needy students are instructed to take advantage of this facility and complete their higher education from this college.

# 12) CANTEEN FACILITY:

The college has canteen facility where the eatables are provided at subsidised rates. Food products are prepared by taking care of health and hygiene of students and staff and there is separate seating arrangement for students and staff in the college canteen.

#### 13) ANTI-RAGGINGAND GRIEVANCE REDDRESSAL CELL:

The college takes an undertaking from every student about an anti-ragging oath.

The college also has a well developed Grievance and Reddressal Cell to redress and take care of the various issues of students and staff. A Suggestion Box has been kept and maintained by this Committee to invite suggestions from students.

#### 14) WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL:

The college strongly champions the cause of women empowerment and equal opportunity for female students. To strengthen this further, as per the rules of University of Mumbai, the college has an active Women Development Cell that takes care of the issues of female students and staff. The WDC undertakes various programmes throughout the year for women.

The Management has provided air-conditioning facility to this I.T. Centre. The Students of B.Sc. I.T., Banking and Insurance, T.Y.B.Com and other Computer Courses take advantage of this advanced and well-equipped computer laboratory.

# 17) LATE SAVARMAL HANUMANDAS AGRAWAL GYMNASIUM:

### 24) NATIONAL CADET CORPS (N.C.C.):

The Unit of National Cadet Corps is started in our college from June 2010. It is a semi-military organisation which gives disciplined training to young college boys and girls students. It indirectly helps the students to get commission in military as well as in various government and private sectors. It also helps to create an atmosphere of discipline among the college students and in society in general.

- **SPORTS:** The sports department organised various sport activities and motivate students to participate in college level sports activities, inter-collegiate, inter-university level sports competitions and our students won gold medal / silver medal etc. Sports department provide excellent facilities of indoor and outdoor games to our students.

# (33) ADMISSION:

All admissions are provisional and subject to the confirmation of the University of Mumbai.

#### **Condition of Admission**

- i) An admission given to the student in this college to any class shall be only for the particular term.
- ii) A student admitted to one class shall not get automatic admission to the higher class in the subsequent year. It shall be at the discretion of the Principal.
- iii) Every student is expected to take fresh admission every year / term and there would be nothing like claim or reservation of seat for the College Students to any class.
- iv) Students should be punctual and regular in attendance and should observe the discipline in the College premises. Students who are found irregular in attendance and / or have bad performance at the College / University Examination will not be admitted to the second term / subsequent year as the case may be. Cases of such students shall be decided by the Principal.
- v) Admission of Students to any class in this College is subject to the Rules and Regulations of this College, contained in this Prospectus and that of the University of Mumbai framed from time to time. The Rules and Regulations of the University of Mumbai will supersede the rules, conditions and regulations of the College, wherever dispute arises.
- vi) Students once admitted will be considered as enrolled for the whole academic year subject to his / her good conduct and observance of discipline unless he / she informs the Principal in writing of his / her intention to leave the College. The College shall be entitled to recover the Tuition Fees for the whole year.
- vii) The Admission of Students failing to pay their Second Term Fees within the prescribed time will be automatically cancelled and their names will be struck off the roll. He/She will however have to pay all the fees for the second term.
- viii) When a student cancels his / her admission, the fees shall be refunded according to the rules prescribed by the University of Mumbai from time to time. A specimen of such rules is given below separately.
- Every student seeking fresh admission in this College will be interviewed by the Principal or his representative and the selected Students will be required to take admission after submitting the form and paying the necessary fees within the time limit announced.
- x) Every Student seeking admission has to submit the prescribed College Admission Form duly filled in affixing a passport size photograph thereon together with necessary certificates in original and the copies thereof.

- xi) Admission form will not be accepted if it is torn and / or is incomplete or is not accompanied by the necessary certificates and the copies of documents.
- xii) Admission shall be deemed to have been given when the admission form is submitted duly completed in all respects and when the College accepts the necessary fees.
- xiii) Failure to pay the fees after submitting necessary documents may result in the non-granting of admission.
- xiv) As per the rules of the affiliation, 50% seats have been reserved for the Students of the Backward Classes, However, if the sufficient number of Backward Class Students is not available the remaining seats will be filled up by admitting the students from the Non-Backward Class.

# \* B.Sc. – Information Technology \*

## Introduction of B.Sc. in Information Technology:

The college has introduced B.Sc. (I.T.) three year degree course in Information Technology with the aim of providing professional education which will enable the students to get good services as soon as they complete their graduation. With the introductions of B.Sc. I.T. the college has become a full-fledged college. This course is introduced on fully permanent non-grant basis. The reserve category students can get various scholarships so that no economic burden fall on the parents.

# Eligibility for admission :-

# Students from the following categories will be eligible for admission :

- 1) Candidates passed H.S.C. (Science Stream) with Mathematics as one of the subject and securing not less than 45% (open category) or not less than 40% (for reserved category) in the aggregate at first attempt.
- 2) Candidates who have passed Diploma in Computer Engineering / Computer Science/Computer Technology / Information Technology / Electrical, Electronics and Video Engineering and Allied branches / Mechanical and Allied branches / Civil and allied branches of Engineering after S.S.C. (Xth standard) are eligible for direct admission to the second year of B.Sc. (I.T.) degree course. However the Diploma should be recognized by the Board of Technical Education of any recognized Government body. Minimum marks required 45% aggregate for open category candidate and 40% aggregate for Reserved candidates.

#### **Duration of Course:**

a) The course shall be a full time course. The duration of the course shall be six semesters spread over three years.

- b) Number of Students: A batch shall consist of not more than 60 students.
- c) The course shall consist of 29 subjects & Project.
- d) Total number of lectures per paper (subject) shall be minimum of 50 and a maximum of 55, each of 50 minutes duration.

# Students should note the following University Rules: 0.114-A:

The last date of submission of enrolment form duly completed in all respect to the University by the College / University Department / Recognized Institution and the Directorate of Distance Education of the University, in respect of students, admitted by them to the First Year Courses for the respective Certificates / Diploma / Degree Examination for which an enrolment fees has been prescribed, will be 31st August every year.

1) Application for enrolment received by the University after the last date fixed for the purpose is over i.e. Between the prescribed period from 1st August to 30th September every year a late fees of Rs. 150/- per application shall be charged.

Application for enrolment will not ordinarily by accepted after 30th September every year except with the special permission of Vice-Chancellor. Application for enrolment received during the period from 1st October to 31st December of every year will be accepted with the special permission of the Vice Chancellor on payment of late fees of Rs. 200/- per application.

No application for enrolment will be accepted if received by the university after 31<sup>st</sup> December every year and admission of such candidate as have not submitted their enrolment form to the University through their colleges on or before 31<sup>st</sup> December every year shall be cancelled.

2) Students passing examination equivalent to Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) Examination conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and higher Secondary Education and intermediate Science / Commerce of University of Mumbai Universities / Boards and seeking admission to the F.Y.B.Sc.I.T., F.Y.B.A.F., B.B.I. Class will be admitted only on production of provisional Eligibility

Certificate issued by the University of Mumbai. They should submit the migration Certificate, statement of Marks and passing certificate in original alongwith a copy within two months from the date of admission failing which their admission is liable for cancellation.

3) Students coming from other constituent / affiliated college of the University of Mumbai will be admitted provisionally on production of the No Objection Certificate from the college last attended. Their admission will be confirmed only on receipt of the Transference Certificate from their previous college. For this purpose, they should submit the Transference Certificate application form and T. C. Fees to the previous college.

#### 4) RULES OF REFUND OF FEES:

The amount of Caution Money or Library Deposit will be lapsed after one year from the date of students departure from this college.

#### 5. RULES OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE FOR THE STUDENTS:

#### 1. General:

- a) The College attaches great importance to discipline and expects all concerned to observe scrupulously the Rules and Regulations made for this purpose, because a healthy discipline is essential for sound education.
